BARRIE BROWN – ROTOROA ISLAND - PROJECT JANSZOOM - ZIP

Our guest speaker tonight was Barrie Brown. He had been a partner at Coopers & Lybrand (later PWC).



He spoke of three things, the first being the redevelopment of Rotoroa Island



This island of 80 hectares had been used by the Salvation Army as a men's treatment facility for alcoholism (with a women's facility at neighboring Pakatoa Island). There were old outdated buildings on site and some 20,000 pine trees. The Salvation Army no longer required the facility and the Next Foundation and its philanthropic but

modest founder negotiated to lease the Island for 100 years and convert it into a Conservation Park. Barrie and some others were persuaded to participate in, and help with, the project. The pine trees were cut down and mulched to create 40,000 m³ of mulch.



Several of the old buildings were removed which had asbestos issue problems and the shelter block which had its 10 steps approach

(representing the 10 stages of recovery from alcoholism) was upgraded to provide a refuge for rest and recovery, with accommodation. 400,000 native trees have been planted. A Brown Kiwi recovery programme was initiated, they needing some 12 months to gain sufficient condition to become independent. Takahe and Saddleback were also introduced for conservation. Barrie told us that some 68,000 native birds have been lost to predators. He also said that Andrew Poole, son of our own member, is now Chair of the Foundation.

Next Foundation The emphases of the Foundation are on environment and education. Another of its projects has involved predator control work at the 22,500 hectare Abel Tasman National Park named Project Janszoon (after the middle name of Abel Tasman). Possum levels there are low and they do not cause major damage, but stoats are a significant predator problem and there are 300 km of stoat lines with traps at 100 m spacing, that is 5,600 traps, 3,100 trap boxes and 1,341 A24 self-setting traps. It takes some 20 – 22 days to service all traps, but visitor numbers reached 320,000 in 2018/19 which is three times that of any of the other New Zealand Great Walks.

The Abel Tasman Birdsong Trust was launched in 2012 and the restoration of species such as Kakariki and Kaka has rewarded visitors with delightful morning chorus bird song.

Zip Pest Control While the Trust has been using 1080 poison, this is not ecologically desirable or popular. It has, however, taken out some to 15,000 possums in the West Coast area. Moves are afoot to replace this with Zip Pest control measures which are electronically programmed and send camera information remotely improving the efficiency of the pest control process. An information packed and stimulating presentation from Barrie, thank you, and good to know there are such good people in the world and to know there are these conservation steps being effectively taken.
